

Academic Information

[Enrolled in 2020 or later]

Choose one from language proficiency scores, academic festival, English presentation, academic paper, or club activities.

Standardized English test (TOEIC) scores:

- Grading Criteria (Passing Standard): 850 points or higher (A)
- Eligibility: Students enrolled in the 1st through 6th semesters
- Submission Deadline: July 31 / January 31
- Transcripts that have expired are not accepted upon submission.

※Regarding TOEFL, TEPS, and IELTS (excluding TOEIC), a decision can be made after consultation with the Dean, so inquiry is required.

Academic Festival:

- Participation is open to all grades
- Teams perform in English on stage, including musicals, plays, and group discussions
- Application: June, Announcement: November
- Apply as a group (minimum 4 people)
- Details will be announced at the orientation.

Passing Criteria: Reviewing professor determines pass/fail status and evaluates after presentation -> A, B

Graduation English Presentation:

- Participation is open to all grades
- English presentation, either individually or in a group (up to 3 people).
- Registration: First week of every semester (first week of March / first week of September)
- Open to the audience, held once every semester
- Details will be announced at the orientation.

Passing Criteria: Reviewing professor determines pass/fail status and evaluates after presentation -> A, B

Academic paper:

- Select a field of interest from areas related to major courses such as English Literature, English Linguistics, and English Education (Applied Linguistics) (Poetry, novels, plays, translation, English education, phonetics, practical English, etc.)
- Thesis Application: Beginning of 1st Semester / Beginning of 2nd Semester
- Eligibility: 5th semester or higher
- Submission Schedule: By the 12th week of each semester (3rd week of May / 3rd week of November)
- Passing Criteria: Reviewing professor determines pass/fail status and evaluates after presentation -> A, B

- All students (domestic and international) who choose the academic thesis option must, prior to application, meet with their prospective academic advisor to discuss the thesis topic and obtain the advisor's approval (submit the approval form).
- Domestic students who choose to write the academic thesis in English must submit proof of a TOEIC score of 800 or above.
- International students may choose the academic thesis option only if they submit a TOPIK Level 5 or higher score for a Korean-language thesis, or a TOEIC score of 800 or higher for an English-language thesis.
- Any academic thesis written using AI-generated content shall be automatically disqualified and receive a failing grade.

Club Activities(small group):

- Submit deliverables after participating in an undergraduate club for at least one semester.
- Registration: At the beginning of each semester
- Presentation: End of semester (June / December)
- Eligibility: Currently enrolled students in their 1st to 7th semesters (based on the applicant's standards)
- Passing Criteria: Reviewing professor determines pass/fail status and evaluates after presentation -> A, B

[Exception Clause]: In special cases, such as for students with disabilities, completion is possible through an alternative assessment via the undergraduate faculty meeting.

[Prior to the 2019 entering class]

Academic field trip, Junior English Workshop, and language proficiency scores are **all mandatory**.

Academic field trip: Principle of attending at least once before graduation

※May be replaced with an equivalent report or self-produced video recognized by the decision of the major faculty meeting (Pass/Fail after evaluation by the reviewing professor)

Junior English Workshop: Participation is generally limited to 3rd-year students; 2nd or 4th-year students are eligible (prior inquiry with the department is required).

Group Formation: End of 1st Semester. Presentations: Early 2nd Semester

Plan the presentation format and content in groups, and prepare a creative presentation.

Details will be announced at the orientation.

※May be replaced with an equivalent report or self-produced video recognized by the decision of the major faculty meeting (points awarded after evaluation by the reviewing professors).

Standardized English test (TOEIC) scores: Submission Deadline: May 30 / November 30

Expired grades cannot be accepted

Submission in the semester immediately before graduation

※Regarding TOEFL, TEPS, and IELTS (excluding TOEIC), a decision can be made after consultation with the Dean, so inquiry is required.

Graduation grade calculation method

Junior English Workshop (30%)

1. Moderator, team leaders, members of the winning team: 30 points

2. Other members of winning teams: 25 points

3. Students who do not fall under 1) and 2): 20 points

Official English test score (70%)

1. TOEIC 850 or higher: 70 points

2. TOEIC 800 or higher: 60 points

3. TOEIC 750 or higher: 50 points

Final grades are based on absolute evaluation by summing the scores.:

(90 points or higher: A, 80 points or higher: B, 70 points or higher: C)

[Exception Clause]: Submission of TOEIC score of 900 or higher exempts you from the Junior English Workshop and grants a Workshop grade (30 points).

To receive an exemption from the Junior English Workshop, submit by the deadline corresponding to the 5th semester.

Students with a second major can graduate if they meet the language proficiency requirements alone.

In special cases, such as for students with disabilities, completion is possible through an alternative assessment via the undergraduate faculty meeting.

※The same applies to second majors as to first majors.
